

Procedures at City Hall






Municipal Tax



Municipal tax is tax that must be paid to the city you are living in. This tax money is used for public services (such as garbage collection, road maintenance, libraries, etc.) in Kawagoe City.

When you receive a tax payment statement, please pay the amount at a bank, convenience store, or at City Hall before the deadline date. You can also pay via smartphone or with a credit card.









Health Insurance




Everyone living in Japan must join the health insurance system. Health insurance can reduce the cost of treatment for illness and injury.

Pension



A pension is money you will receive when you are no longer able to work because of old age illness or injury. You must pay insurance premiums

How to Call

- 1) State the nature of your emergency: "There's a fire" or "I need an ambulance."
- 2 State the location of your emergency.
- 3 State your name and telephone number.

Earthquake



When the ground shakes. We don't know when they will occur. During a large earthquake, buildings may collapse and fires may start.



Typhoon



These are storms that often happen in summer and fall.

Heavy rain and strong winds occur. Please try to remain indoors and stay away from rivers and waterways.

What Happens



Telephone lines may be disconnected.



Electricity, gas, and water may be unusable.



Trains and buses may be unavailable.



Shopping for daily essentials may not be possible.



Nursery School/Kindergarten



Nursery School: Children from the age of 0 can be cared for if their parents are working and unable to look after them at home. Please submit your application at City Hall.

Kindergarten: Children from the age of 3 can be cared for in an educational environment to help them grow healthily.

An "Guide to Education for International Children" is available with information about life in elementary and junior high schools. The guidebook is available in Japanese, English, Chinese, Vietnamese, Nepali, and Tagalog.

Garbage Rules (How to Dispose of Garbage)

Separate garbage by type.



Garbage collection days are determined by where you live and what type of garbage it is.



Garbage must be at the collection area by 8 a.m.

Places to Visit in Kawagoe



Kurazukuri Zone (Old Storehouse Zone)

A historic townscape that captures the atmosphere of the Edo Period.

The buildings feature black plaster walls and massive tile roofs.



The Time Bell Tower is the symbol of Kawagoe. The sound of the bell can be heard four times per day. Small candy shops can be found on Kashiya Yokocho (Penny Candy Lane).





Honmaru Goten of Kawagoe Castle

The main hall of the castle, where the load of the castle worked during the Edo period, has been preserved to this day.

This building was used in a similar way to how city halls are used today.





Kita-in Temple

This temple was strongly connected with the Tokugawa family.

It is famous for its main hall, which was originally part of the Edo Castle, and its numerous stone Buddhas.





Kawagoe Festival

A traditional festival that began in the Edo Period.

It is held annually in October for two days. The gorgeous and lively floats travel through the town during the parade.





Hikawa Shrine

This shrine is famous for worshipping the matchmaking god of marriage.

Many people visit this shrine in hopes of finding love. The Omikuji (fortune slips) are famous for their sea bream shape.
